Marc Bohner holds a MSc and PhD degree in Materials Science from the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology of Lausanne (1990 & 1993). His career included positions as postdoctoral fellow at the University of Utah (1994-1995), and the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology of Zurich (ETH Zurich; 1995-1998). Currently he is a member of the management board and group leader at RMS Foundation, a private testing, consulting, and research lab. Beside his activities in testing and consulting, his research career focus has been in biomaterials, in particular bone graft substitutes / calcium phosphates. He holds over fifteen distinct patents, is the inventor of 4 commercial products, and has published and presented widely in his field (>100 articles; >500 citations per year; h = 44). His teaching positions have included adjunct and affiliated appointments at the University of Sherbrooke (CAN), the University of Bern (SWI), and ETH Zurich (SWI). His professional service has included: Editor, Acta Biomaterialia (IF = 6.0; 2008→); President, Swiss Society for Biomaterials + Regenerative Medicine (2009-2012); President, GRIBOI (2009-2016); Councilor, Swiss National Science Foundation (2016-); and membership on a number of societies. In 2014, Marc Bohner was awarded the “Racquel LeGeros Award” of the International Society for Ceramics in Medicine” for his “Contribution to Calcium Phosphate Research”.

Marc Bohner has been a member of the ESB for the past 20 years. Apart from an active participation at all ESB congresses and most general assemblies since 1997, he has presented numerous talks and posters. In 2009, he acted as co-chairman of ESB 2009 in Lausanne, which is to this date the largest ever ESB congress. At this occasion, he initiated and organized the “Industry Day” which included (among others) a technological fair and an “exhibitor evening”. In 2013, Marc Bohner was elected in the ESB council, where he currently acts as secretary.
