## Call for Nominations - ESB Scientific Achievement Awards 2026

Nominations are now open for the ESB Scientific Achievement Awards 2026:

George Winter Award, Jean Leray Award, Klaas de Groot Award, and the International Award.

ESB members are warmly invited to nominate candidates who have made outstanding contributions to the field of biomaterials. These awards recognise excellence across career stages, including early- and established-career scientists, individuals demonstrating exceptional mentorship and guidance of young researchers, and scientists who have spent most of their careers outside Europe.

The deadline for nominations is February 20, 2026.

### **ESB Official Journal Updates**

**Biomaterials Science** has launched an <u>official ESB2025 collection</u>. This collection showcases some of the research that was presented at the 34<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the European Society for Biomaterials, held in September 2025. As the official journal of the ESB, *Biomaterials Science* works in partnership with the ESB to highlight some of the top research from the community. This year's collection also features additional papers from ESB members. We hope you enjoy reading this collection of featured research. **All articles are free to read until December 31, 2026.** 

Biomaterials Science also launched a new themed collection on "3D and 4D bioprinting", guest edited by Professor Nasim Annabi. The collection showcases advances in biomaterial and cell deposition for creating artificial tissues and organs, scaffolds, and drug-delivery platforms, including emerging 4D, stimuli-responsive approaches. All articles are free to read until January 31, 2026.

**Nominations are now open for the** *Biomaterials Science* **Lectureship**, an annual award recognising outstanding early-career researchers in biomaterials. Open to worldwide nominations, the lectureship typically honours researchers within 12 years of their PhD, with full recognition of career breaks. The award includes £1,000 to support travel to present at a leading international conference and an invitation to publish a research article in Biomaterials Science with a complimentary journal cover. **Nominations close on January 31, 2026.** More details on the award and nomination process can be found here.

### **Biomaterials Advances Innovation Award**

The *Biomaterials Advances* Innovation Award is open for nomination. This award recognises a mid-career scientist who has made an outstanding contribution to the biomaterials research field and who has the potential to make an impact beyond academia.

We strongly encourage you to nominate your candidate. The submission **deadline** is **January 31, 2026**. The Award ceremony will be held at the 35<sup>th</sup> ESB conference scheduled to take place from 7 - 11 September 2026 in Antwerp, Belgium. In agreement with the ESB Board, **voting is restricted to YSF members aged 40 or younger**. We strongly encourage all eligible members to take part and contribute to shaping the future of the YSF.

### How to vote?


- 1. The list of candidates, their CV and application forms can be found on the YSF Elections page
- Log in to your ESB user account and ensure that your membership status is up to date.
  If you attended the ESB 2025 Conference, your membership should have been renewed automatically, provided that the email address used for conference registration matches the one associated with your ESB account. Please verify this before voting.




3. Navigate to the ESB Elections tab in your personal account.



4. **Enter your date of birth** to confirm your eligibility to vote in this election.



5. Select exactly five candidates (no more, no fewer), and click "Place your vote".



6. A confirmation message will appear, indicating that your vote has been successfully recorded.

## **YSF Call for Projects - 2026**

The ESB-YSF Call for Projects supports events and workshops that help train young scientists and promote biomaterials knowledge across Europe. For 2026, we have an **increased total budget of €1,700**, while the maximum funding for a single project remains €1,200. This increase means that the YSF may be able to sponsor more than one event, depending on the quality of applications and requested budgets.

Now it is all up to you! The call for events/workshops to be organised in 2026 is open (**Submission deadline is January 31, 2026**).
