As you are probably aware, *Biomaterials Science*, edited by the Royal Society of Chemistry, is the official journal of the ESB. *Biomaterials Science* is an international, high-impact journal exploring the underlying science behind the function, interactions and design of biomaterials. Recently, an agreement with the RSC has been made that grants ESB members a 15% discount on the APC for open access publication in Biomaterials Science. When an author selects to publish under open access he/she will be presented with the option to insert his/her ESB subscription ID, at which point the 15% discount will be applied. You can find your ESB subscription ID by logging in on the ESB website as a member, and in your Account select the tab "Subscription & Invoice" and clicking the "+" in the latest membership year. Your subscription ID is updated every year with the renewal of your membership.

Finally, we would like to draw your attention to a survey for a study investigating the impact orientation of principal investigators (PIs) undertaking publicly funded medical device research. The survey aims to understand how PIs of research projects understand and address impact in their day-to-day activities as PIs engaged in basic, applied or translational scientific research towards the design and development of medical devices.
